Measuring carrots

As we are reading the supertato books Mrs Tagger thought it'd be a good idea to measure some vegetables. Our outside tray has been filled with carrots of varying sizes and the children have used measuring tapes, rulers, cubes and hands to measure them. We have explored using language such as 'bigger, taller, higher, longer, shorter, smaller, lower' when measuring and have been making estimates before using the measuring tools.



Home learning:

We have gone beyond 10 this week and have learnt the numbers 11 and 12. Please practise counting to 12, writing a numberline to 12 and exploring ways of making 11 and 12 using household objects or things out and about in the garden/forest etc. Try splitting the numbers up as many ways as possible (eg 12 is made by adding groups of 3, 4, 6, 2 and 1's)
