Curriculum News 5 10

We have been looking at properties of both 2D and 3D shapes in **Maths** this week. We have so far looked at being able to identify how many sides, vertices and edges shapes have while also understanding what lines of symmetry are and how to find them.

Our **English** work has seen us complete our story chapters for our fantasy stories, taking in our previously designed world descriptions, character profiles and designing a method to access our imaginary world from the real one. Next week we will be finishing this unit by adapting our chapter to be told from the 1st person perspective.

We have continued our work in **Science** on plants and this week we looked at the life cycles of plants and compared them to the life cycles of other living things.

We have been creating some more artwork in our **Enrichment** sessions this week, we also looked at the explorer Robert Falcon Scott and talked about his voyages to the South Pole at the start of the previous century.
