Curriculum News 5 10#

Our intentions for the next few weeks in **Maths** will be to revisit a few areas that we have done earlier in the year, this will include division, fractions and money. It has been a while since we have done too much work on these so it is nice to revisit and further cement our learning in these areas. We have started a new unit in **English** looking at the book *Traction Man* and using it to further our understanding of storyboarding, writing dialogue for characters and ensuring we are using 1st person for this. We will be looking at creating our own characters and writing from different character perspectives ensuring we understand their points of view. In **Science** we have begun our final unit of the year looking at space and the planets in our solar system. Space is always a fun and exciting thing to study and the children have really taken to this topic already and are keen to build on their knowledge from having it as topic in Willow class. **Enrichment** has seen us begin to look at the Great Fire of London and the events surrounding this important time in the capital's history.

Homework

For the remainder of this term we will be switching to Maths homework rather than spellings. Each child will now have a booklet in their plastic wallet with maths problems to solve from all the core units we have studied this year. There are 28 questions in the booklet and each week the children will need to complete 4 questions. The booklets will be taken in and marked by me on Tuesday. There will then be a session on Wednesday afternoons for me to spend some individual time with any children who have misconceptions about the work. They will then go home again with the children on Fridays. This first week, children are required to complete questions 1-4 of the booklet only. Please do feel free to offer support to your child if they need it but please do not tell them the answers, give them a chance to work them out for themselves.
