



Pupil Premium

Use of the Pupil Premium at Bourn Primary Academy

Overview

The Pupil Premium is designed to ensure that funding to tackle disadvantage reaches the pupils who need it most. The funding is allocated to Local Authorities and schools with pupils from Reception to Y11 who are eligible for free school meals (FSM), are looked after or have parents currently in the Armed Forces. In 2012/13 the funding allocated was £600 per child, £250 for children of Armed Forces families. This rose to £900 and £300 respectively from 2013.

From April 2012 the coverage of the Premium was widened to include those eligible for FSM at any point in the last six years.

Total amount allocated to the school for the current academic year

£8100 was allocated to the school in the financial year 2013-14 (last year's funding was £9859)

How the previous year's allocation was spent (2012/13)

Last year the allocation was used to fund:

Music lessons

Residential trips

1:1 Counselling/behavioural support outside of school hours

1:1 Tutoring in literacy, numeracy and reading outside of school hours

Home tutoring

How will the money be spent this academic year?

This year the allocation is being used to fund:

Music lessons

Residential trips

1:1 Counselling/behavioural support sessions led by TA

1:1 Tutoring in literacy, numeracy and reading led by teachers

Social skills groups/nurture groups led by TA outside of school hours

The effect of the expenditure on the educational attainment of those pupils who were eligible for pupil premium

Academic progress.

The children have made either satisfactory or good progress.

In all the core subjects: Reading, writing and maths 100% of the children made either satisfactory or good progress.
