## Literacy



The children have really enjoyed their extended story writing sessions this week. Using the story plans devised last week, we thought about our story structure, making sure we included a beginning, a middle and an ending. We tried to use lots of imaginative and descriptive vocabulary. We also practised editing our work, checking that we had punctuated our writing with capital letters, full stops and speech marks.

## Numeracy



This week the focus has returned to the value of numbers and the use of models such as the number line or hundred square. Some children had to find numbers 1 more or 10 more or less. Some of the children looked at rounding numbers to the nearest 10 by looking at their position on a number line. We also perfected our calculation strategies for addition and subtraction and related these to problem solving.

## Enrichment Curriculum.

The children have been involved in a range of activities this week. On Tuesday the Year 1s looked at some of the artists who were chosen for their inspiring Olympic posters. The children studied the choice of material used and the style of marks they made to create an original picture with an Olympic theme. This motivated the children to reproduce one of the artist's posters and experiment with different media to give the best effect.

The Year 2 children spent Tuesday morning taking part in their multi skills tournament as part of the Olympic topic, working hard to earn points for their team. All the children received a commemorative badge at the end of the morning and the teams who won Gold, Silver or Bronze were awarded certificates. The children all worked incredibly hard during the morning and were very well behaved.
