Practical Work in Mathematics

We had many practical lessons in mathematics this half term, in particular those lessons linked to 'measure'. We were set the challenge to rearrange the tables so everyone can see the White Board. This involved planning table arrangements and annotating them with the lengths and breadths to find the total perimeter. Formulae such as l for length and b for breadth were used. Compound shapes were also discussed.

When we looked at triangles and angles we did some origami to make the three types of triangle: scalene, isosceles and equilateral. We measured the sizes of the angles and also found the lines of symmetry.


Practical work makes maths more fun and you get to practise and use your maths skills.
