Dear Parents/Carers,

In spite of the extreme heat this week, the children have managed to concentrate extremely well in their lessons, although far too many children are not bringing in their water bottles. It is important for them to keep hydrated, so please check each day that they have them.

English: We have had a very strong focus on grammar and apostrophes this week, in order to ensure everyone is secure in their knowledge for year 5. The children have been practising the use of apostrophes for contractions (would not - wouldn't) and for possession (to show ownership - mum's bag). The hardest aspect is knowing where to put the apostrophe in plural noun cases (the boys' ball). The children have also been developing their use of the comma in complex sentences (to show subordinate and relative clauses) in order to fully understand how to apply commas.

Maths: This week the children have been learning about Roman numerals up to 100 for all, and 1000 for more confident children. The children have had to work out the values of the Roman symbols by cracking a code. Spotting patterns between examples and our number system, they could work out the value of each Roman symbol. The children can now complete a number square to 100; use a few symbols to explore the highest and lowest numbers they can make; and some have gone on to explore other Roman maths such as measuring distance.

Other Subjects In Enrichment this week, we have been looking very closely at the different eras of the Stone Age and beyond, and what distinguishes them from each other, by focusing on the technological advances that influenced great changes. The children used animations and texts to extract key information and create detailed time lines to represent the changes. In Science, the children continued with their study of teeth, this time looking at the structure of a tooth, and how teeth grow.
