Curriculum News

Our focus in Maths this week has been on money. The children have been working hard to recognise the different coins and notes. We have revisited counting in multiples of 2, 5 and 10 to help us count coins. The class have used coins to create different amounts and showed a variety of ways to make different amounts. Please let your child practise counting money and recognising coins where possible.

RWI has started again and the children are working hard in their new groups. Your child's RWI book will be changed once they have completed all of their learning relating to the book.

The children have produced some lovely artwork of the Union Jack using a pointillism technique in the style of George Seurat. They also sketched a symmetrical drawing of Queen Elizabeth.

In R.E. the children learnt about langar. Langar means 'free kitchen' and every Gurdwara has one. Guru Nanak Dev Ji created the langar because he believed in equality and wanted everyone to be treated equal. Langar meals are vegetarian so that everyone can eat!

The children are enjoying their science topic about plants. Every morning the children run in to check how much their bean has grown. The class are enjoying filling in their bean diaries and on Tuesday we measured the height of the beans. The tallest stem was 23cm after only two weeks!

On Tuesday afternoon we learnt the difference between wild and garden plants. The children then went on a wild plant hunt on the school grounds. We found ivy, daisies, nettles, clovers, buttercups, brambles and dandelions.
