## Read, Write Inc.

This week we have started our RWI programme. Each day the children will learn a new sound and will practise saying, reading and writing the sound during activities. Each time a new sound is introduced, a handwriting practise sheet will be in your child's plastic wallet. Please support your child at home by encouraging them to use the correct letter formation and spotting the new sounds in reading books. You could have a sound hunt at home and out and about, spotting things that start with the new sounds!
