NOTES FROM THE TEACHER

Christmas play rehearsals have begun and we are delighted with how well children are already beginning to learn their lines. Props and costume lists will be shared with families in the next couple of weeks. Please do keep encouraging the children to learn lines at home.

On Monday, the children are being asked to come to school wearing odd socks as we support 'Anti-bullying Week'. A monetary donation is not expected for this. Children will participate in a range of assemblies to develop their awareness and understanding of bullying over the week.

English

In English we have been continuing with our recount unit on World War 1. The children have found out more about what it was like for soldiers in the trenches, practised converting between first and third person and then began to research information to write a recount about the Christmas Day Truce from 1914.

Maths

In Maths we have been doubling and halving numbers. We have practised recalling doubling and halving facts and have used a partitioning strategy as a mental / informal jotting method to double and halve bigger numbers that we don't necessarily know off by heart. We then moved onto multiplying and dividing numbers by 10, 100 and 1000 using place value grids to help our understanding. We ended the week analysing line graphs and children created their own from a set of data.

Enrichment

This week we have continued to learn about mummification practises in Ancient Egypt. The children also learnt more about the Egyptians beliefs
