Help please!



Curriculum news

RWI has started again this week and children have settled well into their groups. Well done to the children for being so enthusiastic in their sessions!



During our Maths lessons, we have been focussing on 2d and 3d shapes. We have been looking at the correct spellings of the shapes, many of which are rather tricky and will need plenty of practice! All of the children have made incredible progress, and have a super knowledge of 2d and 3d shapes. In Science, we have started a new topic-'Materials' which will be our focus for the remainder of the Autumn term. We have done some cross-curricular learning in English by discussing why we wear poppies. I was impressed by the children's understanding and mature discussions. We ended the week by creating our own poppies and learning what each colour of the poppy represents. See if your child can remember!
