We have started a new unit in **English** on fantasy stories, which the children seem to be enjoying thus far. We have looked at the common features of fantasy story telling and what the requirements are for a story to be considered a fantasy. The children will be writing their own fantasy story using what we have learned as their hot task next week.

In **Maths** we are revisiting division and ensuring that we can get to grips with the method. Division is traditionally the trickiest of the four operations to learn but the children have made great progress this week already. We will be looking at properties of shapes and statistics before the end of this term.

We have been able to get artistic in our **Enrichment** lessons this week with some artwork for our display going up; we made hand shaped polar bears which the children will be able to take home once our topic work for this term is finished.

Finally, we have started a new **Science** unit this week looking at plants and their life cycles.
