English

The children have revisited non-chronological texts on 'How to Survive your SATs'. Maths

In Maths this week, the children have been visualising and classifying patterns. They were given a series of diagrams and sequences and then had to identify the changes between them. The key task was creating mathematical explanations to describe the patterns and predicting what would happen next.

Art

We have continued our work with our Artist Study of David Hockney. We looked more closely at his photographic work, specifically 'joiners'. Joiners are photo collages based on one subject. The children then used photos of themselves to create their own portrait joiners. They look really effective!
