## Maths

We have been comparing and ordering numbers up to 1000 this week and using  $<$ ,  $>$  and  $=$  signs to compare three-digit numbers. The children have been using their knowledge of place value to solve number problems. We have also started to learn our 4 times table so feel free to quiz them at home on it ;o)

## English

This week we have been reading the folktale 'The Tiger Child' by Joanna Troughton. As a class, we agreed on the key events in the story that were important in the message the story was telling us. The children then wrote their own versions of the story, being imaginative about the adventures that the tiger child went on whilst looking for fire for his uncle, whilst not changing any of the key events that happened.

## Enrichment

We have been learning about Anglo-Saxons villages this week. We looked at the types of houses they lived in, the crops they grew and the animals they farmed. In groups, the children have been designing and drawing their own Anglo-Saxon village.

The Mental Maths booklets have gone home with your children this week. Please help support them each week with their learning of a new level. The first few levels may seem too easy for them but please don't worry the levels steadily build in complexity and it is essential that they establish a secure knowledge of the foundation levels before moving on. Children will work through the books at their own pace and only move on when they are confident with the level. Books need to come back into school every Thursday so that we can check on their progress.
