

Weekly Review - Hazel Class

We have continued our work in Maths looking at addition and subtraction this week. We have explored using related facts to help us work out answers to more tricky questions and we have worked on applying this to number bonds to 100. We will soon be moving into looking at methods to work out 1 more or 10 more of any given number and then applying these to subtraction as well.

The children have really enjoyed our unit on poetry and particularly the poems of John Agard. This week we have looked at the poem entitled 'The Bi-phibians are coming' and as a class we have all contributed a verse for a class poem which is in the same style and structure as this one. Next week the children will be challenged to use what we have learned so far to compose their own complete poems using the structure of one of a few poems we have looked at over the past few weeks.

We have continued our exploration of space in our science lessons. This week we have looked at constellations and what they are. Next week we turn our attention to the Earth where we will be looking at volcanoes and geysers.

We have also been studying Neil Armstrong and the Apollo 11 mission in more detail this week. The children have learned all about the first man on the moon and have written their own fact files on him this week.

There's a chill in the air, the big coats have come out and they're selling mince pies in Tesco. All of this can only mean one thing: Christmas is coming!

While it still may be a few weeks away yet we have taken some time this week to design our Christmas cards for this year in order that they can be sent off and printed in good time.
