

Weekly Review - Hazel Class

This week we have begun a unit in Maths focusing on addition and subtraction. We will be looking at using fact families and inverse calculations and we will be working with effective strategies to add/subtract 1, 5 and 10 from any given number. There is a lot to cover in this unit and we will likely be continuing this work past half term and revisiting it again later in the year.

We have finished our work with fables this week. The children have all had the opportunity to write and develop a fable of their own. It has been great to see so many children channel their creativity in this work. We are starting a new unit looking at poetry, in particular the poems of John Agard. The children will be looking at adopting the rules of rhyme and rhythm and they will be taught to develop and follow a sequence in their own poetry writing by the end of this unit.

Our topic work is on the space race and the events that lead up to Neil Armstrong becoming the first person to walk on the moon. We will be exploring this fascinating area of history in the next few weeks.

We have been studying the story of Creation from the Bible in our first R.E. unit of the year. The children have been thinking about taking pride in what we have made and being grateful for what we have. We will continue to look at this part of the Bible in the coming weeks.

A huge thank you to everyone who came to our assembly this morning. We had a lot of fun putting it together and we hope you all enjoyed it. Another huge thank you to Mr Chauhan who came in to talk to the class today about a special Hindu festival. It is always wonderful to have visitors come in and share their expertise with the children. I know the children always enjoy these experiences.
