In Maths this week we have begun our new topic of learning: addition and subtraction. The children have played various games linked to addition and subtraction and reminded themselves of how to use the column method for addition (particularly what to do when the digits add to more than 10).

We have also begun looking at statistics, with a particular focus on line graphs.

In English we have been looking at different types of non-chronological reports: making comparisons between different types of reports, identifying key features in them, answering questions based on what they've read in a non-chronological report and looking at how newspaper headlines are purposely made to be eye-catching and 'snappy'.

In History we looked at the Reformation, started by Martin Luther during the reign on Henry VIII. Children have started creating a comic strip story board to remind them of this event, which resulted in the church splitting into 2 – the Protestants and the Catholics.
